
Year 6 Shallowford Farm


We're so proud of the way they've embraced their new roles and bonded as a new class. It's been a joy to watch their confidence grow and friendships start to blossom.

As part of this learning:


- The children created families out of pebbles, representing the special people in their lives.

What a fantastic start we've had to our R.E. learning! We ventured out into the playground to explore signs of God's Creation. 
The children have been learning to play the glockenspiel in music. Yesterday they worked with a partner and learnt the notes 'C' and 'G'. They were absolutely fabulous.

The children were investigating different materials. They were exploring how the shape of an object can change. They had a chance to test different objects to see if they could be bent, twisted, squashed or stretched.



What a brilliant week we have had in Justice Class!








Let's Celebrate... Gold School Games Award














I am thankful
