

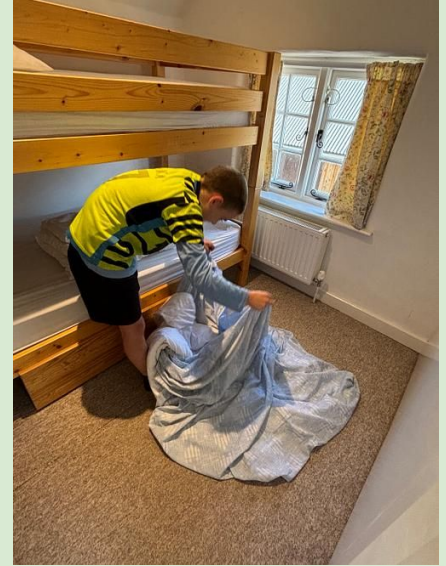
Shallowford Farm Residential
