It's been so lovely to welcome all our children and families back. School is vibrant and filled with children's laughter and learning again. It's been such a long time and we've missed them. Now more than ever, regular and punctual attendance is crucial to your child's achievement in school,

begin our catch-up programme to support them with the term they have missed.

We will celebrate the classes with the highest attendance and punctuality each week and they will earn 5 minutes extra play on a Friday, to help you get them into school in the morning!

The expectation for every child's attendance is at least 97% and above.

If your child is going to be away from school, we need to know each day before 9:30 am. Thank you for your support in this matter.
