Dear School Family,

The children really are settled now and have been an absolute pleasure to have in again. We've really appreciated the warm weather this week too and they have had plenty of time outdoors. Next week, we move onto a more normal learning platform, but still with wellbeing at the heart of it.

It's been a tough week for many families being worried around COVID symptoms and trying to book then wait for test results. It's also cold season and the symptoms can seem quite similar.

The three key symptoms to watch out for are: a high temperature; loss of sense of smell or taste and a new, continuous cough lasting more than an hour, or 3 coughing fits in a 24 hour period. You do not need to keep children home for any other symptoms unless you normally would. I'm pleased to report that we have had no positive cases of COVID at Keyham since March, which means our protective measures are working.

Please can I ask again that we ensure we are following the risk assessment guidelines as it is vital we all do our bit to keep everyone safe.

Please continue to follow the one-way system in through Renown Street and out through the lane, but be aware that buggies will be using the main gate, so please allow them space as they come out. We're keen to work together to keep everyone safe.

WORSHIP AND LITURGY



Each Monday, we begin the week with a liturgy based on the Sunday Gospel. From this, we get an action to practise throughout the week. Liturgies take place in class and I will share these on our Facebook page, along with our Celebration assemblies weekly, so you can participate remotely. The theme this week is:

God is Generous



In this week's Gospel, the owner of a vineyard goes out early in the morning and hires some workers who agree their wage. During the day the owner goes out to the marketplace at different times and hires more workers. At the end of the day he pays them all the same money. The workers who were hired in the morning complain this is unfair because they get exactly the same as those who've only been working for an hour. The owner says he can be as generous as he likes and no one can complain - because they agreed it was a fair wage when they started work. In this story, Jesus teaches us that he is there equally for all of us. Whenever we turn to him, he will be there. He asks that we celebrate and are glad for other people when they are rewarded.

Action: Be generous, both to yourself and others.
