Dear School Family,

It's been a mixed week weather wise but I think autumn is well and truly here! Please can you ensure your children come to school wearing a coat as we will be getting them outside for breaks and lunchtimes where possible, simply because we feel fresh air and exercise are good for their wellbeing.

COVID Update

Thank you for continuing to follow our school COVID Risk Assessment. Please remember to keep to the one way system when entering and exiting the school site. The only exemption is for buggies or if someone is using crutches as the cobbles and steps can be a bit tricky. Where a buggy needs to come through, please stand back and let them pass before entering. Again, we have had no positive tests in school, so our measures are working.

COVID Reminder

The three key symptoms to watch out for are:

- A high temperature;
- A loss of sense of smell or taste

- A new, continuous cough lasting more than an hour, or 3 coughing fits in a 24 hour period. If a child displays any of the above, we are directed to call you immediately and for you to pick them up. If a member of your household is symptomatic, you need to isolate for 10 days or until you have received a negative test result.

You do not need to keep children home for any other symptoms unless you normally would.

Getting tests has been difficult. Advice is: Families requiring a test to first try the national routes. This is through ringing 119 or via the web site:

If you require further advice or your child is unwell for other reasons, please ask us or give us a call so we can support you. Ideally, we want all pupils in school as that is the best place to catch up with their learning. Where they can be in, we want them to be and we will support you in any way we can.

If children are off and self-isolating but otherwise well, please have a look on Google classrooms where the teacher will be sharing their class's learning each week and we can make sure they aren't missing out.

Parking

Thank you for the support with parking. I know it gets a bit harder when it's raining. Be aware that there is a council car driving around with a camera and it's an instant fine of £60 if you are parking on the zigzags or stopping in the street or on double yellow lines. The council will continue to patrol the area to ensure we are keeping our children safe. The key thing we want to do is return your children to you safely at the end of the day. Thank you for working with us on that.

Home Learning

Home learning grids have gone out today. You should receive an email from your child's class teacher with their home learning grid attached for the autumn term.

The email will also give you further instructions about homework books and accessing Google classrooms. There is a deadline for the penultimate week in December.

The expectation for every child's attendance is at least 97% and above.


If your child is going to be away from school, we need to know each day before 9:10 am. Thank you for your support in this matter.
