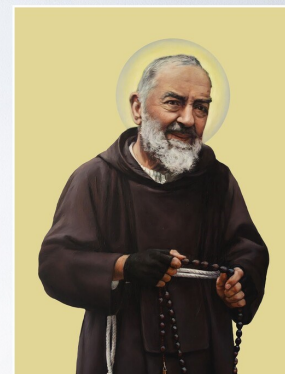

## REMINDER—OCEAN STREET—ROAD CLOSURE
