Dear School Family,

We have reached the end of our Spring term and it has been fantastic to have our school family reunited for the last 4 weeks. The children seem happy to be back and have enjoyed being with their friends! There has been a fantastic work ethic and a calm and purposeful atmosphere around the school and they have been working hard.

We return to school on Monday 19th April and we will continue our staggered starts and exits at the end of the day. Remember to stick your agreed time slots:

A - F - 8:40 - 2.55 (Approx 52)

G-M-8:50-3.05 (Approx 56)

N - Z - 9:00 - 3.15 (Approx 40)

Please remember to continue to follow the guidelines and our Risk Assessment which I have reshared with this email. Pick up and drop off times are our biggest risk periods. Please make sure only one parent or adult picks up at your designated times; remember to follow the one-way system and depart the site quickly, ensuring children are not running around at the beginning and end of each day. We are getting there and more restrictions will lift over Easter if we continue to keep safe.

We will continue with wearing PE kits on our PE days and Zoom assemblies and liturgies as we cannot mix in larger groups inside. We will also continue with our cleaning, our bubbles and our handwashing as the last thing any of us wants is another Lockdown. Please continue to be safe and mindful over the holidays too. The main change in school will be that we will restart clubs and after-school activities and details of these will be sent out in the first week back for the following 5 weeks.

### **Attendance**

Government guidance is now that all children are back at school. If your child is poorly it is vital that you call the school and let us know or respond to a call from us. If we don't hear from you we are required to report it to our Education Welfare Officer who will do a home visit to check everyone is safe. This is because there have been some awful cases where something happened to a parent and a child was then alone and unsupervised and unable to let anyone know. Our first duty to you and your children is to keep them safe, so if we don't hear from you we do have to follow up. Please let us know if they are poorly so that we know you and your family are all safe!



# WORSHIP AND LITURGY Alleluia!



Over the next few days we will celebrate Easter weekend where we recall the crucifixion, death and resurrection of Jesus. In this Sunday's Gospel we recall the Resurrection.

It is still dark when Mary of Magdala comes to Jesus' tomb. In John's Gospel 'darkness' is more than just the absence of light. The disciples are still certain that Jesus has died and that all hope is gone. It is the women that find Jesus first. When Mary finds the tomb stone moved, she runs to the disciples in confusion. Peter and another disciple race back to the tomb to see what has happened. Jesus' body has gone. It is only when they fully enter the tomb that everything becomes clear to the disciples and they 'see' the truth: Jesus has risen from the dead!

Sometimes we have to cut back or let go of some of the things in our lives to enable us to grow. Seeds fall to the ground and die so new life emerges. The resurrection shows us that after the darkest hour where things can seem impossible and hard, there are always better things to come.

#### Action

Did you know that the Easter egg is hollow because it represents the empty tomb. It also signifies growth and new life. When the egg is cracked and hatches, new life emerges from within.

When you open your Easter eggs, reflect on this. What new things will you encourage? What will you grow in yourself this year?
