# **Keyham Barton News!**

Today we have had our Ugandan mufti day where the children came in wearing the colours of the Ugandan flag! Thank you to all families for supporting this. The children enjoyed wearing their home clothes.





We have reached the end of our first summer term in one piece! Next week is half term and the school will be closed for the week. Enjoy the time reconnecting with your family and friends now that more restrictions are lifting. I have four nights' camping booked with my own children, so please join me in prayer for good weather for all of us! Monday 7th June is an INSET day where staff will be training. The school will be closed to all pupils that day, but we re-open for our final term on **Tuesday 8th June.** We look forward to welcoming you all back then.

We will review our restrictions at the start of the new term. We will continue with the staggered drop-off and pick-up times. Parents no longer need to wear masks in the playground, but they do need to be worn inside communal areas in the building. We will continue with children coming in their PE kits on PE and club days; not least because this saves valuable learning time! We ask that children do not bring in anything other than the essentials between home and school where possible - unless something has been pre-agreed with your child's class teacher.

# WORSHIP AND LITURGY Father, Son and Holy Spirit



This Sunday is the feast of The Most Holy Trinity. St Patrick used the image of a three-leaf clover to explain what this means. Although the clover is one leaf, there are three parts or aspects to it. In this way, St Patrick explains what God is like. He says there is God the Father in heaven; God as a man in the person of Jesus, who experienced life as we do; God the Holy Spirit, the spiritual presence of God in our lives that helps us in times of challenge or when we pray for help. Using a simple image, St Patrick explains a complex belief. It is the Trinity where the sign of the cross comes from. Whenever we make the sign of the cross, we draw a cross on our bodies and remember that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are all interconnected. In this week's Gospel, Jesus arranges to meet his friends on a mountain. When the disciples see Jesus, they are in awe and wonder of him. Jesus asks them to do a special job, to spread the message of God's love and to baptise everyone in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Jesus promises he will be there for us until the end of time. This promise is part of our creed. Creed comes from the Latin word 'Credo' meaning 'I believe.'

There are many beautiful images of the Holy Trinity. Could you design your own? Have a look at images on the Internet for inspiration and then think about what this means to you. Can you come up with an image as St Patrick did, to explain what this means?
