### **COVID Roadmap Update**

Currently cases in Plymouth are on the rise and I have a duty of care to do all that I can to keep our children and their families safe. Guidance is that we limit, or do not have, families in school for key events as we normally would at this time of year. I'm really saddened by this but I also don't want children missing out again this year on things like Sports Day, however, nor do I want to risk closing a bubble and families beginning the summer holidays after this challenging year, having to isolate. So this is how I am proposing the children have their key events and we keep everyone safe. **Sports Day** 

We will not be able to host Sports Day in the usual way this year, but we will be running two separate Sports Days for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Each class will have a session with our Argyle coaches, where they will take part in an exciting range of activities to earn House points. While we cannot have parents in for this, as it will be more than one bubble (distanced) we will take photographs for you and share them on Google Classroom, the school website, and the school Facebook page. We will keep bubbles separate and each event will be risk-assessed to ensure we are sanitising and not sharing equipment. The key thing is that the children do not miss out again and they get to both compete and have fun!

### KS1 - Friday 9th July KS2 - Friday 16th July.

On your child's Sports Day, they will need to wear their PE kit to school and a t-shirt to match their House colour (Lourdes = blue, Carmel = yellow, Fatima = green and Buckfast = red.)

#### **First Holy Communion**

Our next class is Tuesday 29th June at 3:15pm.

For the First Holy Communicant Mass, we cannot have the usual Sunday Mass celebration but we will have it on Wednesday 14th July 10am for the communicant's immediate families only. Children will sit on the same bench as their families, distanced in the church. If the weather is nice they will have a party in the playground with their class, and if it's not, this will be in the hall. Parents are invited to the Mass but I suggest you have a celebration with wider family at home or over the weekend to limit mixing outside of bubbles.

Children are invited to wear their Communion clothes all day in school and we will photograph the party and share for the families.

#### Year 6 leaver's Mass and Presentation

This will take place on **Wednesday 21st July at 2pm** in the playground, or in the church if wet. As it is their last gathering, we will sit the children together and immediate family can sit, distanced, in the church or playground as they are large spaces. Families can take children home afterwards.

When Jesus gets to Jairus' house he is told he is too late. However, Jesus says to Jairus, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' Jesus takes the girl's hand and says, 'Get up!' To everyone's astonishment the little girl gets up and is healed.
