For the times we forget to be grateful.





A reading from the Gospel according to Luke
Glory to you, O Lord



As Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, he walked along the border between Galilee and Samaria. When he came to a little town, he saw ten people who had leprosy. They stayed back a little way from Jesus, but they yelled to him, “Jesus, please have pity on us. Help us.” When Jesus saw them, he said, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” As they went on their way, they were all cured of leprosy. One of the ten, as soon as he saw that he was cured, ran back to Jesus. All the way back, he was shouting praises to God. When he got to Jesus, he knelt down in front of him and thanked him for healing him. Now, this man was a foreigner, a Samaritan. Jesus said, “Weren’t all ten people healed? Where are the other nine? Why has only one person come back to thank God? And this man is a foreigner!” Then Jesus said to the man who came back, “Get up! You may go now. You have been helped because you believe.”

Time to reflect on God's words for us
today.



A leper is a person who has a disease called leprosy. This disease causes sores all over the body. Leprosy was very common in Jesus' day, and people who had this disease were thought to be dirty and unclean. They were required to stay away from other people because of the fear that they might infect them with their disease.

One day, Jesus was walking through a small village when He saw a group of ten lepers. They stood far away from Jesus and called to Him, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us." Obviously, they knew who Jesus was and that He had the power to heal them. When Jesus heard them, He called back to the lepers and said, "Go, show yourself to the priest."

As the lepers went on their way to see the priest, they looked at their skin and the sores were gone. Jesus had healed their disease. They were so happy that they ran up and down the streets singing and dancing. Suddenly, one of them stopped and went back. Praising God with a loud voice, he threw himself at Jesus' feet and said, "Thank You." Jesus said to him, "Weren't there ten who were healed? Where are the other nine?" (Luke 17:11-19) Only one out of ten remembered to say, "Thank You."

God does so much for us! Every day He provides everything we need: food, clothing, and a place to live. Do we ever forget to say, "Thank You?"

Let's stop right now and say, "Thank You," and ask God to help us remember to thank Him every day.

Reflection on the Gospel

womb Jesus.

us sinners now and at the hour of
our death.


God of life, give us the courage to try to make a change to our world, no matter how small, and the faith to know that with you all things are possible


