Dear School Family,

She comes with a lot of experience of SEND having worked at Courtlands and we are delighted to have her expertise. Both have made a fantastic start in challenging times. Finally, we have John Cooper as a part-time caretaker. John will be working with us every week on a Thursday and Friday. I have welcomed him with a very long list of

I am also delighted to let you know that although Mrs Burns is not able to come back into school yet, she is now working from home on our behalf. We have very much missed her and are grateful to be benefitting from her expertise again.

## **COVID Update**

I want to reassure you that we have further tightened our safety measures as cases in Plymouth rise. In the event of your child showing any **one of the 3 symptoms:** 

- A temperature;
- A new continuous cough lasting more than an hour, or 3 coughing episodes in a 24 hour period;
- A loss of sense of taste or smell;

It is vital that you get a test and isolate from the onset of the symptoms; even for one symptom. If a child exhibits any one of those symptoms in school, we will safely and quickly isolate them in the hall and contact you to collect them immediately. The hall is deep cleaned and all surfaces children may have touched are wiped down as an extra measure.

#### **Remote Learning**

I have emailed you all with our remote education policy should we find ourselves needing to lockdown a bubble, so please read the guidance and make sure you are prepared so we can all work together to keep children learning.

The key points are:

- Make sure you can access
  Google Classrooms as this is
  where all children's learning will
  be posted. Try it now and contact
  us if you have any problems.
- Let us know if you are unable to access IXL or TTRS.
- All lessons are shared on Google Classrooms daily now so if your child is isolating they should be accessing this, unless they are unwell.
- In the event of a bubble isolating, siblings will not be expected to isolate unless someone in their family is symptomatic.
- Let us know what help and support you need to access the learning.

The expectation is that all children are accessing 4 hours of online learning a day and we will monitor this. We will contact you to see if we can support you if children aren't. It is so important we keep them learning. We want to give them every life chance.

### **Parking**

As you know we have had ongoing parking issues. The Plymouth Road Safety Team are going to carry out a review of current safety measures and in the meantime there are traffic wardens patrolling the areas at the start and end of the school day, especially the street corners. PCSO's are also visiting and taking numbers of repeat offenders. There is a £60 instant fine for parking breaches.

I have been very grateful for the support from many of you in trying to keep our children safe. Thank you for working with us. We will keep doing everything we can to ensure safety.
