Please keep an eye on what children are accessing online at home and remind children of the age restrictions. Twitter, Snapchat and Instagram are for over 13-year-olds

WhatsApp is for over 16-year-olds. YouTube requires account holders to be aged 18 and over, but it will also allow a 13-year-old to sign up with their parent's permission.

We have had children this week sending unkind messages via Snapchat to each other. This is happening outside of school, as the children aren't allowed their phones during the school day, but it does then impact in school with some children feeling very sad or hurt and this then knocks onto their classroom learning.
