Reioice!



Mark tells us right at the beginning of his Gospel that Jesus is Good News! God has kept his promise and is sending Jesus to save his people.

John the Baptist is God's messenger and is also Jesus' cousin. He is the baby who jumped for joy in his Mother's womb when he and Jesus were first near each

One of John's jobs was to prepare the way for Jesus in people's hearts and minds. He did this by getting everyone ready to welcome Jesus, the saviour promised by God.

Mark's description of John makes it clear that John is a prophet speaking God's message. God wants us to turn our lives around.

COVID Reminder

It is vital that you get a test and isolate in the event of your child showing any one of the 3 symptoms:

- A temperature;
- A new continuous cough lasting more than an hour, or 3 coughing episodes in a 24 hour period;
- A loss of sense of taste or smell.

COVID Holidays Track and Trace

To help us manage the situation into the holidays, please note the following advice from the DfE:

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted.

Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Eg - Children developing symptoms after 3.30pm on Sunday 20th December.

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive

for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

Please inform Miss Rilev (rrilev@kevhambarton.plvmouth.sch.uk) if your child develops symptoms between 3.15pm on Friday 18th and Sunday 20th December and tests positive for COVID-19.
