SPF Cream

Parking Reminder

Following on from this week's parking issues, I am sorry to say that we will have to report any number plates that are parking on the yellow hazards. The purpose of the hazards are to keep your children safe. Please do not park there. It is a £70 instant fine. I have asked for an increased presence from civil enforcement and the council as no-one should be subject to abuse for asking you to keep our children safe.

There are measures in place where the council will be improving the traffic calming measures outside our school also as I am in regular dialogue with the council about this. Below is a reminder of the message from Darren Stoneman who is the Civil Enforcement Officer.

Dear Parents and Carers,

I have been asked by your school to write to you to highlight the need for everyone to make road safety around your school a priority.

Over the past 12 months, life has become very different for us all and more parents than ever are using the car to drop off and collect their children from school. This presents a number of risks; the main one being the risk of a collision between a car and a child. I am sure that none of us would want to see that anywhere in our city.

To support safer roads around our schools, we have implemented a number of measures to try to protect children on their journeys. At your school, this includes a large 'School Keep Clear' area outside the

*main entrance of the school with a designated crossing point: **it is an offence to stop or park in this area. We have also installed a number of Double Yellow Lines in the area to ensure that the street corners are kept clear to help children crossing the roads. Again, it is an offence to park here.***

You will, over the coming weeks, see an increased presence from my team at the start and end of the school day and our camera safety car will be patrolling the area; this will mean that should any vehicle be observed parking or stopping in the areas outlined above, you may be issued with a £70 Penalty Charge Notice. These rules apply to all motorists, including those of you who have a taxi collecting your child.

We have undertaken a survey of local parking availability and there is ample parking in the street surrounding the school for you to be able to park safely and legally to collect your children. Over the coming months, we hope to work with the school to attend some classes or assemblies to work with your children on road safety and heighten their awareness of the dangers on the road.

Trust in Jesus

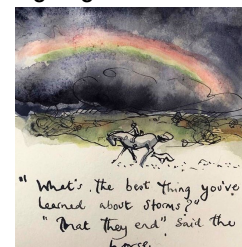


In this week's Gospel, we hear about Jesus calming the storm.

Jesus and his friends set out in a boat to get to the other side of the lake when suddenly a storm blows up. The wind is howling all around them, the waves are really rough and the boat is filling with water. Jesus is asleep, but the disciples are really frightened they are going to drown! They wake Jesus up and shout at him to help them. Jesus tells the wind and the sea to be calm. All at once, the storm stops. Just as he wanted his disciples to have faith and not be frightened, Jesus asks us to have faith and ask him for help in our storms. Jesus can help us through difficult times if we let him.

Action

There are often times where we feel frightened and worried. The storm in this story can be seen as a metaphor for difficult times or times of challenge and anxiety. We may worry about changing schools, moving year groups or anything that feels a bit unknown and scary. Write down your worries or fears on a piece of paper. Say a little prayer giving them to God.
