COVID Update

I shared the new risk assessment on Monday so you can see the additional measures we are putting into place now we are in lockdown.

The key points are for parents to wear masks at drop off and pick up times and that we have reduced contact between bubbles even further across the school. Good hand hygiene, ventilation and remaining in bubbles are key aspects of how we are keeping school COVID negative. So far we have managed this since March, so a huge thank you for all your support. Together we are keeping Keyham safe.

Please can you continue to adhere to the guidance. There is a one-way system in and out of the school so please can you make sure you are following this.

All children should be supervised by one adult at pick-up time and it is imperative that you move quickly off the school site once you have picked up your child so as to reduce the risk of cross contamination. It's vital we keep this going to maintain our success.

Please can we remind you not to drop children in the street or park in the hatched area.

The PCSO's are being advised where people are parking unsafely and there is a speed car with a camera that visits. There is an instant £60 fine if people are parking in the hatched area also.

Please work with us to keep your children safe.

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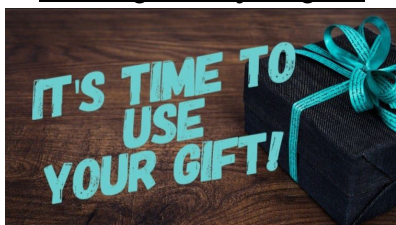
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WORSHIP AND LITURGY
