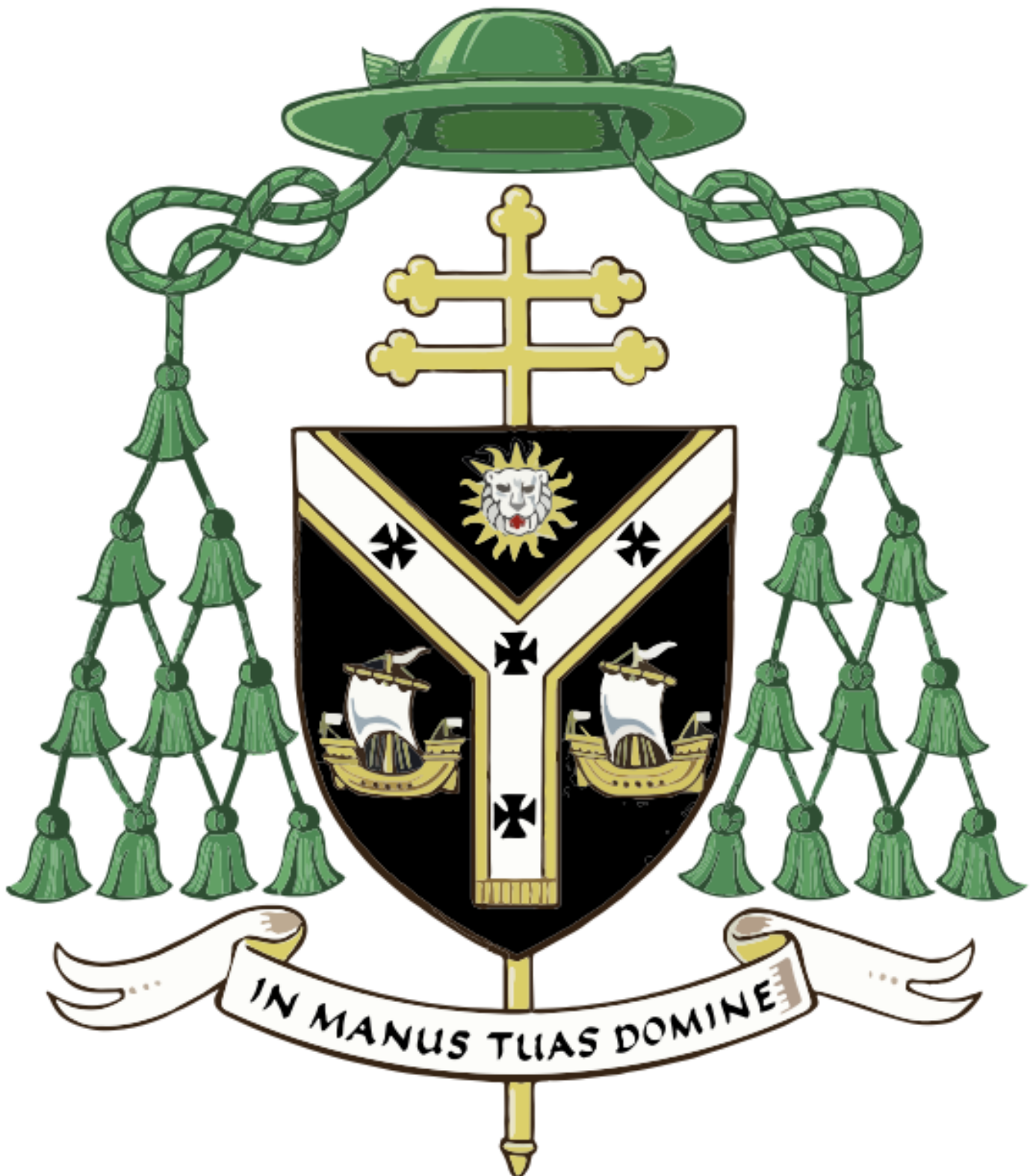

Bishop Mark's new coat of arms as Archbishop

A message from Archbishop Mark

"In sharing this Coat of Arms with you, and the brief that goes with it, I want to thank all for accompanying me with your love and prayers. It means a great deal to me. Explanation of the new coat of arms for Bishop Mark as Archbishop of Cardiff

The Ecclesiastical hat, together with the Double Cross, indicate that this is the Coat of Arms of a Metropolitan Archbishop in the Catholic Church. The shield bears an image of the Pallium, which will be given to Archbishop Mark by Pope Francis in Rome next week. The imposition of the Pallium, from the Apostolic Nuncio, will take place in Cardiff, in the Autumn. The pallium is a sign of the unity between the local and the universal Church, focused on the unity which Archbishop Mark has with the Holy Father. Every Archbishop participates with him, in the pastoral ministry of the Good Shepherd. The shield is in black and golden yellow, the traditional colours of St David.

The ship is an ancient image of the Church; there are two here representing the two local Churches of Cardiff and Menevia. The ship reminds us of the rich maritime history of these Dioceses, as well as that of Plymouth, from which Archbishop Mark has been transferred. Archbishop Mark's family originally came from Connemara in Galway, Ireland, a place closely identified with the sea. The lion is the symbol of St Mark. It rests on a shining star, representing Mary, the Morning Star, she who is Our Lady of the Taper, guiding our way in the following of her Son, Jesus Christ.

The motto, *In Manus Tuam Domini* (Into your hands, Lord), comes from Psalm 31, a prayer of confidence and trust in God. These were the last words prayed by the Lord from the Cross (Luke 23:46). They were prayed also by St Stephen (Acts 7:59) before his martyrdom and were often on the lips of those martyred for their faith, including St Cuthbert Mayne, Proto-martyr of Douai College.

Now that bishop Mark is Archbishop of Cardiff, he is no longer our bishop.

We hope the appointment of a new bishop will happen quickly or even very quickly. However "very quickly" in these matters would mean having a new bishop coming by Christmas, and "quickly" would mean early in 2023.

In the meantime Canon Paul Cummins has been chosen by the Cathedral canons to be our diocesan administrator. He will be in charge of the diocese until a new bishop arrives.

Pastoral Message from Canon Paul Cummins, Diocesan Administrator

Now that Archbishop Mark has begun his new ministry in the Archdiocese of Cardiff and the Diocese of Menevia, I want to let you know what happens regarding the governance of our Diocese until a new Bishop is appointed.

On Tuesday of last week, the Chapter of Canons, who in our Diocese also function as the College of Consultors, met and elected me to serve as the Diocesan Administrator whilst we await the appointment of a new bishop.

My role as Diocesan Administrator comes with most of the obligations and authority of a Diocesan Bishop, particularly to ensure the continuity of the day-to-day affairs and operations of the Diocese, and to provide leadership so that the mission of the Gospel may be taken forward effectively at all levels of the Diocese. Because of the temporary nature of the role, this authority comes with some restraints and limitations: namely that nothing of major importance is to be altered and there is to be no significant innovation such as a new diocesan-wide programme or major initiative during the vacancy. The intention is to prevent decisions or actions that might harm or prejudice the rights of the incoming Bishop.

At this stage, we do not know the duration of the vacancy. I am grateful and humbled by the trust that the Chapter has placed in me for this role, particularly as this is a new experience for all of us in the Diocese.

In today's Gospel we heard that our duty is to spread the good news of the Kingdom of God. This will always be our mission as a community and as individuals. May we all continue to take every opportunity to, as St Paul says, 'serve one another ... in works of love' and to love our neighbours as ourselves.

Please pray for me and for our Diocese as we go through this period of transition. Please also pray that those responsible for choosing our next Bishop will be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and choose the right man for our Diocese. I will be praying for you.
